EMOA Committee Meeting Report - January 16th 2012

EMOA Development Plan Review - The committee reviewed the EMOA Development Plan and for each of the current activities reviewed what has happened and what needed to be done in the next year. A new version of the development plan will be created following the meeting.

Junior Squad - Need to ensure there is more information on how to get in to the squad and get this in EMEWS and on EM website (see article in EMEWS later).

Urban League -It was agreed that EMOA should look to have momentoes for the urban league with 12 awards based on the standard 6 male and 6 female groups. We need a volunteer to coordinate the league. Please contact the editor if you are willing to do this. It should just be to co-ordinate the results across the 4 events. DVO hope to host their event in November at Wirksworth.

Night League - EMOA also want to see a Night League set up for next winter. Most clubs are already running Night Events so we also need someone to co-ordinate these events and create a Night League. Again a volunteer is required to co-ordinate this. Please contact the editor.

East Midlands League - It was agreed that for the Green and Blue courses we should add extra awards for the top juniors in these from next year. We plan to publish the top 3 juniors in EMEWS as well as top 10 of the overall set. Also have the Short Green in the League this year.

Annual Volunteer Day - EMOA wish to retain the Annual Volunteer Day. However, we do need someone to co-ordinate the 2012 Volunteer Day. Again volunteer via the editor.

Awards System for Volunteers - It was felt that this is really at a club level rather than regional level. Need to encourage clubs to make use of volunteer awards in councils etc (often folk won't put themselves forward but if see it gets extra publicity for the sport they will stand). Also clubs should be encouraged to look at national awards.

Support for Senior and Elite Orienteers - It was noted that if any club wants to provide senior coaching in parallel with Junior Squad this could be done (may simplify logistics, etc). In addition Richard Robinson suggested that we may want to consider, rather than the Junior Squad putting on an event, they could host a Coaching Day for a club. Putting out so many kites and providing suggested exercises. If clubs interested they should contact Richard Robinson / Hilary Palmer and will look to stage first session in September (may be on a Saturday).

East Midlands Constitution - The party reviewing the constitution are still looking at it and it is hoped to have a proposal for the next EMOA meeting to review.

EM League 2012 - The list of events is later in EMEWS.

Future Events - The following future events are planned for the Region:

- 3rd November 2012 LEI have proposed hosting a Midlands Night Champs.
- 3rd February 2013 Midland Champs planned to be in Sherwood Forest Access problems resolved, slight change to use area not used for some time.

- 17th February 2013 British Club Champs / Compass Sport Cup Round Fineshade Woods: 12 month embargo in place
- April 20th 2013 British Sprint Champs Loughborough University 24 month embargo.
 Currently being mapped. Planner and Organiser are appointed.
- April 21st 2013 British Middle Champs Stanton Moor Still some issues but looking to resolve them.
- 7th July 2013 Yvette Baker Trophy Final LOG to host at Belton.
- November 2013 British Schools Championships DVO will host at Shipley Park all OK.
- JK 2014 Possible involvement no correspondence recently.

Famous at Last?

World Cup Round 3, Czech Republic and Round 4, Switzerland 2011

I had had a positive season with my second place at the British Elite Middle being the highlight and beyond my expectations for the year; but there was one main goal for the year that I made last winter that I had not completed; GBR Team selection for a round of World Cup Races. My form since June had not been great, not helped by my training been fragmented a little due to injuries and struggled on a GBR development team training camp at Euromeeting in June. I had pretty much written off any chance of being selected for either of the final two rounds of World Cup races, so was delighted when I was invited to run both World Cup Rounds 3 and 4 in the Czech Republic and Switzerland respectively. NOC's Helen Palmer was also in the team for both rounds with Peter Hodkinson also of NOC selected to run in Switzerland.

We were greeted to clear blue skies and warm sunshine in Prague, weather we were treated to for the whole trip, and made our way to Liberec in the north of the country in the Jizera Mountains and overlooked by the iconic Ještěd Tower. We arrived with enough time to check out the terrain on the model area. The terrain was typical Czech Terrain with steep valleys, pine forest of mixed runnability with areas of intricate rock detail; there were plenty of brashings on the floor to deal with too.



The World Cup races in Czech comprised a Middle race on the Saturday with a chasing start long race with dynamic gaffling. We had quite a long time to wait in quarantine for the middle race as the women's race was first. I started the middle race well but wasn't feeling too strong through the terrain and up the hills. The events were both live on Czech TV and TV cameras were out in the forest and in some areas there were numerous cables particularly the leg 5-6. I

made a two minute error at no.7 and was caught by a Czech runner who started 2mins behind and then proceeded to make a few other smaller mistakes and never felt like I was running all that well. I finished disappointed with my performance (76th out of 89) over 10mins down on winner Pasi Ikonen but not disastrous; the other male Brits generally didn't fare too well today. In the women's, Helen finished in 45th position with Dana Brožková taking the win on home soil.

The Long on the Sunday turned out to be one of the most enjoyable but tough races I have raced; 16.5km with around 750m climb. We started the long in the race arena in front of a decent crowd, the TV cameras and large screen. We picked up our map from a map tree just after the start and were immediately greeted to a 2km+ leg. I chose a different route to the two runners who had started just a few seconds in front of me but ended up in a pack with them anyway at no.1 as we converged at the control. We had a Phi loop at no.5 and ended up in a large pack of runners who were on their way round their second part of the loop. I was orienteering well and making good plans; something we had spoke about with team coach Toni Louisola the previous evening. We had a map exchange at around the 10km point; we were handed our new map as we ran along a taped section. We didn't realise at the time but this was dynamic gaffling to immediately split up groups of runners going into the next butterfly loops. We had a long leg into the last, small butterfly loop before the finish and surprisingly ended up with the same runners that I started with despite only seeing them fleetingly around the course. I finished the race in 62nd on the day in 2:04:27 and 65th overall. I was happy with my technical performance making less than 90s of mistakes but did make some poor route choices on 3 of the long legs which maybe lost me 4-5mins. Helen was 44th on the long finishing 44th overall.

The following day we flew on to Switzerland for a training camp near Neuchatel in the north west of the country for a training camp ahead of next year's world champs in the area. We

were staying on the northern side above Lake Neuchatel and had a superb view across the lake from the accommodation. Each day the local clubs had put on a local race with controls and Sport Ident punching out. The areas were largely uninspiring with some heavy undergrowth in some areas but there were also some very pleasant beach forest. Thursday and Friday were easier days with some light training on the model area for the Final World Cup races of the year based around the town of La Chaux-de-Fonds. The model area was predominantly steep but runnable alpine woodland with was both technical and physical but also very enjoyable.

I was determined to run well in Saturday's world cup middle race and felt good after my warm up. I didn't fully focus myself though at the start and didn't make any sort of plan on the first leg. The first leg was quite long for a middle race and through thicker forest than I was expecting. I lost over 4mins on the first control and



made a number of small mistakes shortly afterwards. The split times show I was in last place at the first intermediate control. I managed to pull things together on the second half and was running strongly - better than the previous week. I finished 62^{nd} on the day in 48:32; 12:40 down on the winner Thierry Gueorgiou! Peter made a solid debut to finish in 55^{th} with a time of 45:34. In the women's Helen finished in 54^{th} , 11mins down on the rising start from Sweden Tove Alexanderson who is still only a W20.

The Sunday race was the Post Finance Sprint World Cup Final race for the top 40 athletes in the World Cup rankings. The rest of us ran a National middle race on a fairly uninspiring area with sections with significant undergrowth. I had another poor race technically though again physically felt good - I put it down to mental fatigue; not being used to orienteering this many days consecutively. Prior to heading to watch the Post Finance Sprint we had a number of local juniors come and ask for our autographs. We of course happily signed their O tops; we then had their friends come asking for autographs too! Fame at last!



The Post Finance Sprint was based in the centre of La Chaux-de-Fonds. Most of the town had been closed to traffic, a large screen TV was up in the middle of the square beaming back footage from around the course, all runners carried GPS and the event was also live on Swiss TV. The square was packed with spectators with the start, finish and a run through lots to get excited about. For Great Britain we had Graham Gristwood and Scott Fraser in the men's with Sarah Rollins and Tessa Hill in the women's. The Women's race was first. Tessa produced an excellent run from the earlier starters to take the lead which she held for a long time. In the end Tessa finished in 4^{th} and a podium position (top 6 is a podium position), which was a fantastic result in a world class field. In the Men's Scott Fraser was having a great performance with his intermediate times having him in the top 3 for most of the race but unfortunately he slowed a little over the last

section possibly down to his recent cold and finished just off the podium in 7^{th} . The Swiss men dominated as expected with 6 in the top 10 including winner Daniel Hubmann. This race was a great spectacle and a race I'd love to race in myself; hopefully in future years.

The experience has provided me with a great insight into international racing and has given me the motivation to train even harder to make the step up to running at the World Championships. I would like to thank EMOA for helping me financially towards the cost of the trip as I was along on a self help basis.

There have been comments in the very recent past in connection with East Midlands League Events towards the end of 2011 and at the start of 2012 about various aspects of planning and controlling. I am sure that all of you will need no reminding that professional Event Officials in the UK are, to say the least, as rare as the proverbial 'hen's teeth' – events take place on very regular basis throughout the year, especially in the East Midlands, because of the very hard and dedicated work of volunteers who care about the sport that we all experience in a multitude of formats from the small Level D Event to major Events such as the British Championships. No Organiser, Planner or Controller sets out to make mistakes but, as in all walks of life, mistakes do happen.

Attendance at Training Sessions for 'Event Volunteers' are now leading to formal 'qualifications' and are listed in the British Orienteering database, and personal information can be accessed by completing the 'Username' and 'Password' sections on the 'Login' section of the British Orienteering Home Page and then clicking on the link on the 'Welcome: Your Name' page for 'My Qualifications':

My message to all orienteers in the East Midlands is simply this - the Rules, and the wide range of documents that accompany the Rules, are there to be consulted and used and many of the Rules have the word 'shall' in them whilst many others say 'should'. Either way, if these documents, freely available, are to play their part then they need to be used, especially by Organisers, Planners and Controllers at the very outset of their work and throughout the time leading up to the event. If they are checked and used and if any orienteer still feels that something was not quite right, then an informal but polite comment to the Organiser, Planner or Controller should suffice and, if not, a formal complaint or a formal protest can be made to the Organiser. If in any doubt the 2012 Rules cover all aspects of our sport and should be the first place in which all of us look for guidance.

MID WEEK ORIENTEERING

For those who are not yet aware, we have an emerging Wednesday league, courtesy of BAOC Mil League Central. The league is not new. It has been in suspended animation for several years and was formerly known as the East of England league and incorporated the RAF, mainly in East Anglia and Lincolnshire. However, with the strategic defence reviews and reorganisation of Divisional boundaries, the 5th Division area now covers the central belt from Wales throught the Midlands, to East Anglia. There have already been 3 events this season. They were Luffenham, Hopwas and Tern Hill, Market Drayton. They are based on one per month. However they are growing in popularity and, in particular, civilian attendance. The event at Hopwas attracted 28 civilians and a total of 50 have attended one or more events. The success of the league so far is owed to the dedication of the secretary, Mark Beverley, who is almost single handedly planning and organising the events. This is why I would like to appeal to those keen Wednesday orienteers. We, as civilian clubs could supplement the league by offering to stage one event (per club) and increase the number of events from once per month to one per fortnight. Events generally cater for 3 courses, A - Blue/brown, B - Green, C - Orange/Light Green. So they are similar to low key Saturday morning/summer evening events that many clubs already run. If clubs wish to appoint a Mil rep with a view to hosting a Wednesday event at some stage in the future, it would be greatly appreciated.

Recent Activities

 $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ July 2011: Junior Inter Regional Championships (JIRCs) - The Junior squad finished in 7^{th} position overall at this years JIRCs held in the Lake District which is an improvement on the 9^{th} position that the squad finished in 2010 and also significant closed the points gap with a number of Regions finishing only a few points ahead. The Individual race on the Saturday was held on the Sand dunes of Haverigg. The best results were produced by Nathan Lawson (4^{th} on M14), Ben Beresford (8^{th} on M16), Harriet Lawson (7^{th} on W16) and Jenny Evens (7^{th} on W18). The Relays were held at Simpson Ground which proved a tough area particularly for a relay but consistent performances gave the East Midlands an overall position of 7^{th} and finishing 6^{th} region in the Relays.

 2^{nd} October 2011: Training Session at Harborough Rocks - A large group of juniors including many of the New Squad members had a training day on Harborough Rocks where many were introduced to intricate contour features and rock detail.

 $5^{th}/6^{th}$ November 2011: November Classic Weekend - The Juniors had a training session on Star Post on their way down to the New Forest where they ran the November Classic race on Sunday; an Interland Selection Race for the England Team. There were a number of strong performances from the Juniors including Will Parkinson coming 2^{nd} overall on the Blue (M16) with Nathan Lawson coming 2^{nd} M14 and Harriet Lawson 1^{st} W16 on the same course. On the light green (M14) Euan Tebbut finished 5^{th} while on the Orange (M/W12) Nick Wilson finished 2^{nd} , Finn Lydon finished in 4^{th} with Gabriel Rawlinson finished in 6^{th} overall and 1^{st} in W12 beating many boys in the process.

25th-27th November 2011: Hawkshead Training Weekend - A small group of juniors travelled to the Lake District for a weekend of training organised exclusively for the M/W16 in each of the 12 junior squads. As always a fantastic weekend of training was had with a night relay around the grounds of the hostel on Saturday evening.

December 2011: Walesby Xmas Sprint - As has become custom in recent years the juniors had an informal sprint around the built up areas of Walesby followed by a Christmas fuddle and prizes.
