Long Course 4.8km Start / finish as marked on the map and visit the controls in numerical order from 1 to 16

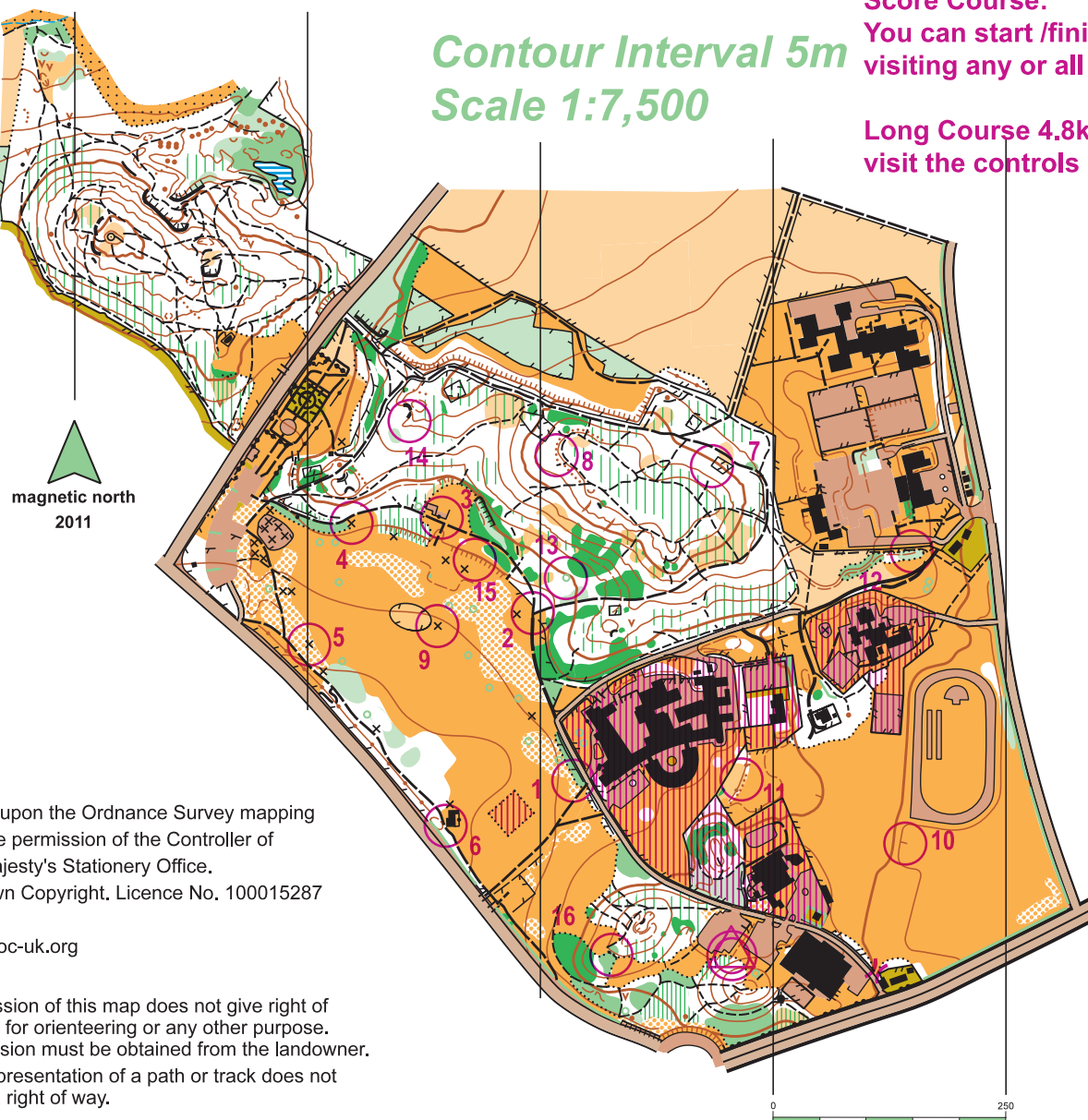
