## Notes from EMOA Meeting on 15th November 2021

The meeting was held in person at the Pace Room in Clifton Village, Nottingham.

**British Orienteering** - Chris Phillips informed the meeting that Peter Hart, the BO Chief Executive, has gone off on long term sick leave.

**Financial Secretary's Report** - Paul reported that there had been limited remittance from BOF in terms of membership fees in the last few months. However, renewal emails should now be going out to members and therefore Paul expects the bulk of remittance income over the next 3 to 4 months.

There have been a total of 28 events taking place in EMOA since the start of the financial year, with 7 of those attracting EMOA levies.

There will be some costs for the hire of the Pace Hall for the Planners and Controllers courses. Paul has no concerns regarding the budget for the year ahead.

**Development** - Mike Gardner had run a Planner's course which had 9 attendees. However, there were another 9 who also needed a course. Based on feedback he was considering running a further course in the new year and running it as  $2 \times 2$  hour virtual sessions to see if that worked.

Ranald Macdonald will run the Controller's course which was to be held the following Wednesday, at which 9 controllers should attend.

Joint practical sessions were planned for both Planners and Controllers at the Hardwick and Walesby events.

Ranald hopes to host an Event Officials Conference in the Spring and invite all EMOA Organisers, Planners and Controllers to attend.

Fixtures -

EMOA League 2021 / EMOA Urban League 2021 - The EMOA Urban League for 2021 has been completed and final results are elsewhere in EMEWS. Prizegiving will take place at Melbourne event on January 2nd. The 2020/2021 Forest League has a few events left and it is hoped that prizegiving will take place on 20<sup>th</sup> February at Martinshaw and Ratby event. John Woodall was asked as President to present the prizes.

The 2022 Forest League currently has 13 events identified. Normally we use half the events plus one to score, so it is proposed to use 7 events as scoring events next year. The league currently only has handicaps upto the age of 75. It was agreed that the age class handicaps would be amended to allow for competitors upto the age of 85 from next year onwards. In terms of the Urban League there are currently 7 events scheduled, so will use 4 events to count in that scoring

Forest England - Ursula had circulated a report from Richard Sansbury from SWOA which had been presented to the ESG meeting. It outlined the recent change in policies by Forest England. There were major changes in terms of access and costs which could well have a radical impact on orienteering in many areas. It was felt by the committee it really needed a CEO to CEO discussion at National level to see if the situation could be improved.

## Speyside 2021

Speyside is the 2021 alternative to the M16 Deeside orienteering tour in Scotland, this year there was no accommodation and there was only 3 days of orienteering instead of the usual week. Everyone's family had to organise their own apartment, so my dad rented a nice BnB for us to stay in. The training was in and around the Cairngorm National Park and featured some very technical areas where contours and understanding them was key.

I got invited to the event thanks to the East Midlands Junior Squad nominating me on the back of some strong results from the past few years in some major, national events. Initially, I was invited to the Lagganlia camp, unfortunately I couldn't make the dates but the Deeside coaches reached out and offered me a place. I'm actually only in my first year of the M16 cycle so I



have the opportunity to go to the tour next year also, but it did mean all of the other athletes were a year older than me. That didn't necessarily bother me, but they were definitely better orienteers at the end of the day!

On the Tuesday before the event me and my dad had to set off at 12pm to get to Scotland by 6:30 that evening, it was a long trip. The next day was an early start and we got to the first location, Uath

Lochan at 9:30 the next day. Each day had a focus and Wednesday's was "Picture", filled with contours, Uath Lochan was a difficult location and so the coaches had us complete a few

exercises to imagine contour shapes by looking up and at the map to make a picture. In the afternoon, with the rain starting to creep in, our final activity was a Peg Relay, where we collected pegs along the course which signified where your next control would be. It was fun but I was already exhausted and the rain was really beginning to fall. I couldn't wait for a nice, long sleep that night.

Thursday's scene was in Culbin forest, a wooded dunes area right next to the coast of Moray Firth. Once again, the map was sprinkled with intricate contours which set to prove difficult. Now focusing on planning, before every loop we had to go over our plan for each leg with a coach to consolidate every aspect of the control. The day started off pretty well, I was enjoying the orienteering, but the rain had something to say about that; it absolutely chucked it down! With athletes cold and wet, the decision was made to call off the afternoon session and we were headed to a local barn to socialise and do a bit more learning. The coaches provided us with a copy of an M21 course at the British Champs in the area and as a group we gave thoughts on the legs and how we would go about tackling each leg.

Ready for the final day, we headed off to Coulmony and Belivat, an area of forest quite similar to the previous two days'. With two focuses that day, Direction in the morning and Purpose in the afternoon, we had a lot to cram in on the final day. Before lunch I did a couple of courses to concentrate on my compass bearings, something in the past I had struggled with, it was helpful and helped me build some confidence in my compass work. Now to bring what we had learned across the entire last few days in the tour's final session. Using SI cards there were a few loops to choose from in the afternoon to help reach a culmination of all the new skills. The final thing we did was an interesting, competitive race where you decided your own handicap and then set off on a gaffled course to race to the finish.

Then, a few days after the event, I received some helpful feedback from the coaches that included some praise and constructive criticism to help further my orienteering ability. Unlike the majority of the rest of the athletes I was unable to stay in Scotland for the upcoming Scottish Six Days. Aside from that I am very thankful for the experience and advice I received and cannot wait for next year where I get to do it all again.



## Badaguish Report

This Summer I was selected for the Badaguish orienteering tour which involves juniors from the lower age class of M/W16. We travelled up to Stirling (not Badaguish despite the name) and although it is usually a residential stay lasting a full week, due to covid we had to stay in our own accommodation with a parent. In addition, it was changed to a long weekend, which involved Friday evening, Saturday, Sunday and Monday Morning.

The first Friday evening involved a 3km time trial at Stirling Track followed by an evening zoom call with the coaches discussing the physical side of orienteering and the plan for the days

ahead. I stayed at a campsite near the Wallace Memorial along with another athlete which gave us a chance to go for a run in the evenings.



On Saturday we travelled to Auchingarroch (day 1 of the 6 days in 2019) where we were paired up with a coach and we were learning bearings and using vegetation in the gap in trees to navigate better. I found this day very useful and learned a lot about navigating in thicker forests. This led nicely into the second day at Dundurn (day3 of the 6 days in 2019) - (map on left) where we were trying to use map memory and corridor

exercises to try and simplify the map and to make the leg easier to combat. The map memory was especially interesting as in some cases it was easier to not look at the map and just to run the leg with your route already in your head despite it being quite a tricky area.

On Sunday afternoon we travelled to Macrosty Park in Crieff (rest day sprint of 6 days 2019) and we raced a mini sprint around some housing and the park that was roughly 3km in length which was tough especially in the heat. The weather for the whole weekend was superb and some of us enjoyed swimming in the River Allan at the end of the day. The final day of the tour was at an area called Polmaise (West Stirling) and we did a first leg (hence mass start) of a relay sprint simulation which was made trickier by using a 10 year outdated map. It was still fun, and everyone finished the course eventually.

Overall, the tour was a great experience despite it being shorter than usual because it brought together the social side of Orienteering more and I thank the British Orienteering coaches for putting it on.

# MINUTES OF THE 56<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELOD ON ZOOM ON MONDAY 14<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2020 AT 19:30

Amanda Roberts started by welcoming everyone to our Zoom AGM, obviously the first time this way has been used to host our AGM.

#### 1. Apologies for absence:

No apologies for absence were received.

#### 2. Minutes of the 55<sup>th</sup> EMOA AGM held on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2019.

It was agreed that the minutes were a true record. Proposed by John Hurley (DVO) and seconded by John Woodall (NOC).

#### 3. Standing Order Change:

There were no standing order changes submitted to this AGM.

#### 4. Chair's Report:

I have now completed my third and final year as Chair and what a very different year it has been.

The year started off in the normal way. The first major event was the EMOA Championships hosted by LOG at Grimsthorpe Estate on 8 Dec 19, and after a very wet November the usually empty beck had become an uncrossable watercourse so courses had to be adjusted to keep competitors safe. Luckily the weather was kind to us on the day as the venue layout meant there was a 2km warm up/warm down to the remote start and finish. With the 2019 Leagues completed, it was all minds on 2020. Diaries were full with club events, EM

League Events, Championship Events and the large regular orienteering festivals like the JK that we expect to attend each year.

Then Covid-19 brought everything to a halt. For most of us the last event we competed in was the CST qualifier on 15 March 2020 with all orienteering events being suspended from 17 March 2020. Both LEI and DVO qualified for the CSC Final and NOC qualified for the CST Final, a fantastic result for our region but unfortunately, the final has had to be postponed for now.

Our Clubs have all tried to entertain their members and keep up the interest despite the restrictions. DVO have run a Maprun league and put on map quizzes on their Facebook page and held weekly quiz nights. LEI have run an Up and Out initiative using their Permanent Orienteering Courses with members submitting their course times. NOC have also been using their Permanent Orienteering Courses with members comparing times on maprun. LOG used Strava and Facebook to organize scavenger hunt challenges, a virtual relay covering the region and a regular weekly quiz. Zoom/Teams meetings has become the new norm for both socialising and running our clubs — a new experience for many of us and subject to the quality of the internet in our more rural areas!

For nearly 5 months we had no orienteering competitions in the usual format, but since 1 August we have been able to run local events by adhering to the British Orienteering Guidance on resuming the sport in a COVID secure manner. Our clubs have used this opportunity to update the way they take entries and payments and organise start times for club events. Maybe it has been the catalyst needed to make changes to the way we have always done things. It has meant more effort has been put into Maprun events, and use of POC's; maybe a more appealing way to access orienteering for busy families with multiple diary clashes.

Going forward is going to be a slow business – many of the landowners/Forestry Commission etc. are reluctant to allow events to be held on their land and this had added to the already long list of reasons they have to turn down access. The latest casualty to be announced is that JK 2021 is cancelled, primarily due to being unable to secure access. Some League events may be able to go ahead – unfortunately the EMUL has to date only had 1 event, with hopefully 3 events that will be able to be take place – so 4 in total. The EML has had 6 events, with a further 4 events hoping to go ahead – so 10 in total. Whether the Leagues will be completed this year or just run on through 2021 is still to be decided.

During all this there has been some good news. Ernie Williams (LEI) and EMEWS (Produced by Mike Gardner, DVO) were awarded the Cover of Year Award in the Compass Sport 2019 Newsletter Awards, recognising that Ernie has produced covers for over 36 years. Paul Murgatroyd (LOG) was awarded the Coach of the Year in the BOF Awards for his contribution to training within the sport.

Thanks to the hard work put in by Anne-Marie Duckworth (DVO) and Ant Squire (NOC), EMJOS had a structured training programme in place to ensure our Juniors had the best chance of doing well over the year. Unfortunately, again, a lot of this has had to be cancelled or reorganised for small groups. Some of the notable successes over the year are:

Jake O' Donnell (DVO) was selected for the England M 14 Team at Interland 2020. Rachel Duckworth (DVO) and Hannah Mather (LOG) also went as travelling reserves.

Both Ben Squire (NOC) and Rachel Duckworth (DVO) are members of the Junior GB Talent Squad. And it is so disappointing for Ben and Rachel, who were recently selected to represent GB at the European Junior Orienteering Championships in Hungary, that the event has now been cancelled

EMOA are pleased to have been able to support these young orienteers. EMJOS have also been fundraising. They ran the Strawberry Hill league event not only to raise funds for their Swedish Tour in Summer 2020 but to give their members experience in organizing events. Unfortunately, this Swedish Squad Trip has been postponed to another year.

BOF ran an excellent Development Conference, attended by 7 of our members, in January. But Covid-19 has meant that the EMOA Planners and Controllers Course and Development Conference have had to be postponed. In the meantime, Ranald Macdonald (EMOA Development Co-ordinator, DVO) has been producing bite size articles covering key planning points and reviewing Rules and good practice for EMEWS.

Finally, I would like to thank the Committee, Club Reps and Job Holders for their contribution over the last 12 months. It has been a strange year when a lot of planned events have had to be cancelled and it is difficult to get enthusiastic about future events when there is continued uncertainty that they will go ahead. But the more we are prepared the quicker we can react when the restrictions are lifted. Particular thanks must go to Chris Phillips (Vice Chair) for his support over the last 3 years; Ranald Macdonald, who kindly took on the role of Development Officer; Mike Gardner (Secretary) who really does deserve a long service award for his commitment to this role and the production of the EMEWS; Ursula Williamson (Fixtures Secretary) for her continued work liaising with the Events Scheduling Group and club fixture secretaries, and finally, Paul Young who took over the role of Financial Secretary at the last AGM.

#### 2018/2019 Accounts

The EMOA year end is 30th June 2020, Roger Edwards has reviewed the accounts and issued the following statement

"I confirm that the accounts for the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020 are consistent with the underlying records of the Association" Roger Edwards CPFA

Roger was thanked for being the independent financial examiner of the accounts and for all his support over a number of weeks in helping Paul present them.

EMOA generated a surplus of £2,018.87 for the 2019/20 year. The Budget was for a loss of £(385.00).

Material variances to the budget are set out below:

- Membership Year on year membership of EMOA clubs reduced in all categories. The majority
  of renewals taken place from November to February; it may be that some members were put
  off by the emerging concerns of COVID-19 in the early part of 2020.
- Event Levies A number of events had to be cancelled or delayed during the 2019/20 year in the first part due to extreme weather conditions and in the latter part by COVID-19 restrictions.
- Sponsorship Income The Budget assumed a catch up in income for 2018/19 and 2019/20 in relation to EMEWS sponsorship. Unfortunately, the previous sponsor ceased trading and a replacement has not been found.
- EMJOS income and fundraising Income relating to EMJOS was higher than budgeted, largely due to the Strawberry Hill event.
- EMJOS expenditure Expenditure was lower than budgeted largely due to the impact of COVID-19 on the number of training events which could be undertaken during the year.
- Other costs Expenditure in the following areas were lower than budgeted; volunteer development, external conferences, coach development and support for talent. This was due to a combination of fewer opportunities during the year and very limited activity after March 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions.

This is my first year as the treasurer and I wish to thank Mark for his support in the handover of the accounts.

There are mixed feelings about the generated surplus in the accounts. Predominantly it reflects the fact that EMOA has raised money but not been able to use it. Often the first 9 months of the financial year are where funds are generated and the final 3 months are when the funds are spent funding coaching, trophies, conferences and junior squad expenses. However, with COVID the impact has been that EMOA has not spent the funds it has generated. We had expected to make a small loss, but both the Accounts and the Junior Squad have seen a small increase in reserves. Paul also thanked Mark Webster for his support during the handover period.

Questions – The event at Strawberry Hill was an EMJOS event and were the funds ring-fenced for the junior squad. Yes, the funds were ring fenced for the Junior Squad.

#### 6. **Election of Principal Officers**:

#### 8. Appointment of Independent Financial Examiner:

Roger Edwards agreed to continue as Independent Financial Examiner for the next year.

#### 9. Approval of Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Statement:

The proposed Budget for the year 2020/21 is set out below for the A.G.M.

Despite the significant impact which COVID has had on Orienteering across the EMOA region the 2019/20 accounts show an increase in reserves. EMOA and EMJOS both remain in a good financial position. I believe the Budget below reflects a sensible balance, enabling EMOA to continue to support development of EMJOS along with providing financial support to East Midlands' orienteers in the areas of coaching, development, and continuation of the regional leagues.

The outlook for the year ahead continues to remain uncertain. BOF has indicated to members that there will be no extension to the 2020 Membership term, nor any reduction or waiving of those fees for 2021.

It would not be unreasonable to forecast a reduction in orienteering events across the EMOA region and / or limitations, on the grounds of safety, on the number of participants for said events.

These factors, combined with the limited number of traditional organised events over the last six months will likely lead to a reduction in memberships.

Membership fees make up a significant percentage of the EMOA funding in any given year; I do not propose making any changes to the existing membership fees. Therefore the fees are proposed to remain as follows:

Senior membership fee £3; Junior membership fee £1; Associate membership fee is £10; and Club membership fee is £15.

Event levy income, from category C and above events, is likely to be less predictable in the year ahead. I propose event levies also remain unchanged for the 2020/21 financial year. 50p per adult and 10p per junior with the first £25 continuing to be retained by the organising club.

Advertising income previously earned from Ultrasport is no longer forecast due to the company having ceased trading during the 2019/20 financial year.

The EMOA contribution to junior squad spending shall be restricted to a maximum loss of £(1000), any extra spending to come from their deposit account and/or specific fundraising.

Support for volunteer development, external conferences, coach development and orienteer talent is forecast in line with previous year's Budgets.

The proposed EMOA Budget for 2020/21 is a loss of £(1,830)

#### 10. Plans for Coming Year:

However, orienteers are good at adapting to change and the sport has done well adapting to meet COVID requirements. Whether the sport progresses to normality will depend on COVID and what happens in the near future. Permission from landowners will be key, and some may refuse permission for their own reasons.

Within the region we have plan for a number of level C events which may take place if there is no further crackdown. Our program is based around the 2 leagues and the EMOA Champs. All events are submitted to Ursula as Fixtures Secretary. Hopefully we will get back to competitive orienteering soon. The East Midlands Champs are planned for the end of November and permissions have been given by the landowners, so it is hoped this will go ahead.

The official's conference planned for this year has been postponed to next year.

Maprun has come in and enables people to get out and do a type of orienteering. I even know of at least one person who has gone out and bought a new phone just so they can orienteer.

I want to thank Ann-Marie and Ant for all their work with the Junior Squad. They are even beginning to host training for squad members again. Club coaches are also getting inventive about how to deliver training. It will be a challenging year going forward but we will rise to that challenge.
