Notes from EMOA Meeting - 27th November 2023

Officials Required - The EMOA Committee will need a new Vice-Chair and a new Financial Secretary at the AGM in September 2024. Please consider coming forward to assist as we need these roles filling going forward (you can talk to any of the committee to understand the roles if interested).

Constitution - The updated EMOA constitution, following the changes agreed at the 2023 AGM, is now available on the EMOA website at http://www.emoa.org.uk/members/constitution.php.

Financial Secretary Report - In terms of income, membership income had as expected been low during the months to November, but now new members and renewals had started to come in. All event levies were up to date. The main expenditures had been on EMJOS kit and talent requests (see below).

Talent Requests - The EMOA Committee wants to continue to provide support for EMOA orienteers. One problem is that there now seem to be higher costs for most tours for those involved (less SportEngland support), along with fewer options to get support for competitors. This has resulted in a number of quite large requests that if these were fulfilled at this stage would leave no budget for other competitors later in the financial year. For this reason the EMOA Committee has decided to cap the amount provided to any one orienteer to a maximum of £250 per annum. That way there should be funds to support most of the requests this financial year. Information on applying and the limit is available on the EMOA website at http://www.emoa.org.uk/members/finance.php. The good news is that we do seem to have a number of orienteers requiring support this year.

Development - Following the AGM where we had no volunteer for the Development Co-ordinator role, John Hurley has volunteered to step forward as Acting Development Co-ordinator in the short term. However, John stated he would want to make sure we managed the development work in a strategic way and his first priority would be to work with the club reps

on the Development Working Party to deliver a development plan in time for the next EMOA AGM. John also wants to request information from each of the clubs as to what each club are doing in terms of development activity (as it may well be that some of this could be shared across the other clubs). The committee agreed to formally co-opt John as Development Co-ordinator up to the next EMOA AGM.

Budget for Development - In the short term £2,000 had been agreed for development activity for 2023/24 as part of the budget. This money will continue to be available for development and will roll over to 2024/25 if not used this year.

Reserves Balance - In the longer term an action had been raised at the EMOA AGM "ACTION: The Officers and Committee members are tasked to report back on the finally agreed figure for an 'EMOA Reserves Balance', and the date for implementation, to the membership by Monday 11th March 2024 at the latest." After discussion at the EMOA Committee the following was agreed. The agreement at the AGM was to drop the reserve balance to £9,000 this year. This is how the budget has now been planned. We will then use the Development Plan that John Hurley is creating to drive the reserve balance proposal to the 2024 AGM (and drive the 2024/25 budget).

Officials Training Day 2024 - Discussion took place on the timing and requirements for the Officials Training Day. Given the majority of the senior officials are heavily involved in the JK, it is proposed that we aim to have a Development Day in the early Autumn of 2024. There are now a number of e-learning courses available to assist with this training (e.g., Planner's course). We should, where available, make these part of our training (e.g., a pre-requisite for attendance on the courses). The training day itself can then focus on the more practical aspects of the training and potentially be of a shorter duration. The courses identified as potentially needed would be:

- Controllers Course
- Planners Course
- Organisers Courses
- Mapping session for expert mappers to discuss the latest map standard updates

Potential location for the course would be Groby Community College (as provides access to Ratby which can be used for practical exercises) or Charnwood College.

If members are interested in attending any of these courses or believe other courses are required please let your club rep know.

Coaching - The new Orienteering Coach Award (to replace the BOF/1st4Sport L2 Coach Award) is being developed with 6 e-learning modules, some online seminars and 1 practical session - these will replace the current 3 days training course. After the initial training coaches will plan and deliver 4 orienteering technique sessions and 1 physical training session and then be assessed delivering a coaching session of approx. 1 hour. If anyone interested in attending please let Hilary Plamer know. This should allow people to complete their coaching qualification within 1 year.

NOC's MapActive - NOC have continued to run their MapActive courses. Stage 2 starts on 2nd December and has 9 people signed up. Details are on the NOC website: https://www.noc-uk.org/Introduction/MRC. NOC are happy to share information to any club coaches if interested.

Club Member Coaching - Hilary is looking to run a series of club coaching sessions across EMOA and has asked each club to offer an area. The sessions would be open to all EMOA members. The initial NOC forest session is on January 13th, but is open to all (names required by 2nd January as numbers are limited by their access agreement) - See https://www.noc-uk.org/Introduction/RO.

EMJOS - See separate report.

British Orienteering Trans Policy - BOF has circulated their Trans Policy to clubs and regions. It is available at https://www.britishorienteering.org.uk/?pg=news_archive&item=6291. The BOF Policy is basically "Individuals are free to self-identify their sex on the British Orienteering database or when entering an event without a requirement for further evidence. At all events and competitions, the male category in all age classes is open to all without restriction..... At the Identified Major Events, individuals will be eligible to compete in the female category in all age classes if and only if they are eligible to compete in the female category under the IOF Transgender Policy..... Any trans individual whose sex assigned at birth was not female and who wishes to compete in the female category at an Identified Major Event must, before entering the event, provide evidence to British Orienteering that they meet the requirements of the IOF Transgender Policy, in accordance with the process set out in Appendix A...... At the Identified Major Events, any trans individuals who are not eligible to compete in the female category under the IOF Transgender Policy may nevertheless be able to participate in that category, but must declare themselves to be non-competitive and will not be eligible to win titles, medals, prizes or trophies, either individually or as part of a team."

It was agreed that as EMOA follows all BOF policies we would adopt the same policy as BOF in terms of our major event (EMOA Champs) and the 2 EMOA Leagues.

- JK The entries should open shortly and at this stage all events seem to be progressing well.
- Future Urban League Scoring Discussion took place on the scoring system used for the EMOA Urban League. The forest league is only score based on EMOA members and after discussion it was agreed that the same approach should apply to the EMOA Urban League (this would not have impacted any winner in 2023 but lower down the tables some folk would have been impacted). The problem was that some events (e.g. particularly those in UK Urban League) attracted more competitors from outside EMOA and this meant the scoring of EMOA members in those events was adversely impacted. The scoring system will remain the same but from the 2024 league onwards only EMOA members will be scored in the league (i.e., first EMOA member in a class = 100, 2nd EMOA member = 96, 3rd EMOA member = 93, 4th EMOA member = 91, 5th EMOA member = 90, etc.).

Quiet Parking & Starts - You may have noticed that some events are now offering quiet parking and starts to help people who prefer not to be in the noise and hustle / bustle of the pre-start. This is aimed at those with autistic tendencies but others may make use of them.

Course planning for elderly and infirm orienteers – Looking at recent event results (not just across EMOA) it can be seen that there are some very long finishing times and lot of retirals on the Short Green course. When planning these courses planners and controllers need to consider the mobility issues of competitors. The following paragraph is being considered for inclusion in the rules "Planners must remember that elderly and/or infirm orienteers have difficulties crossing rough ground – going up and down steep slopes; scrambling over boulder fields and rocky ground; getting into and out of steep sided hollows, gullies, streams, etc; pushing through dense vegetation with low branches; and climbing over fences and stiles. Some competitors use a stick for balance which can also make movement more awkward in the terrain. Hence, as far as possible, such obstacles should be avoided/minimised on their courses." It has also been suggested that we may want to consider including a Very Short Green in the East Midlands League in the future. This will be discussed at the next EMOA committee meeting.

EMJOS Summary September to October 2023

Training, events and JROS camps:

Preparation Zoom call for JIRCS 2023

An evening session (1hour) was arranged to study the two very different areas for the Junior Inter Regional Championships in South Wales.

The individual day was at Kenfig Burrows sand dunes (Port Talbort) and the relay was held on the completely different dense forest Llantrisant Forest (North west of Cardiff). We studied previous route choices from the last events held on these areas - trying to point out to the juniors that the marsh areas can be handrails. Also finding videos posted by mountain bikers to see what the forest terrain is like now because the available map was nearly 10years old.

JIRCS (23rd & 24th Sept) hosted by Wales and Swansea Bay Orienteering Club:

The <u>individual results</u> showed that the East Midlands dropped a few places because of not having the number of juniors to count - only 6 juniors. But we had the following results:

Felix (LEI) M14 14th

Eoin (LEI) M14 21st

Josh (LOG) M16 31st

Ellie (LEI) W16 12th

Hannah (LOG) W18 8th

Robyn (LEI) W18 32nd

<u>Relay results:</u> we ran the girls in the boys race and entered two competitive teams that all completed runs (no mis punching).

Boys relay Ellie, Felix, Hannah 18th place

Boys relay Josh, Eoin, Robyn 27th place

Overall EMJOS cam 11th out of 12 regions.

4th November <u>O' Foundation Lakes training day</u> - EMJOS and WMJS attended the Saturday event together. Combining the coaching staff (male/female, high mountain first aid awareness, experience of the area) and effort required.

The last minute switch of area to Great Tower Scout camp (Graithwaite double booked Derek Allison with a pheasant shoot!) did not diminish the technical TD5 coaching exercises planned by Toni O'Donovan (LEI).

Using local accommodation (Brathay Hall, Ambleside) allowed us to self-cater and keep the food costs down.

Then all EM runners attended the Roanhead sand dunes on Sunday (Ulverston).

JROS Hawkshead weekend for M/W15 & 16 24th to 26th November

All squads arrive on Friday, this permits squads to rotate around three training areas (2 on Saturday and Sunday morning): Esthwaite, Great Tower and Tarn Hows.

East Midlands budy'ed up with Norther Ireland to share a male coach and increase numbers of juniors. Two juniors (Ellie and Josh) attended with Ann-Marie.

Esthwaite challenged the athletes with fine navigation on corridor maps on rough terrain. Also short loops (<1.2km) added control flow and prep for the following legs. An interesting challenge was the no compass exercise - relying on just the contour detail going around the top of a hill. Great Tarn has no undergrowth to speak of, so the corridor exercises were much narrower (harder).

The Sunday morning exercises on Tarn Hows were relatively long (2km) so we split into two teams and ran Trains - staggered start, with everyone waiting after 3 controls for a bit of coach debriefing, before running the next 3 controls. The athletes then went off and did another loop concentrating on the slope detail - some maps did not have paths.

Future training:

The December date for training has not been popular. So we have cancelled this. The next date is 23rd March 2024 probably at Black Rocks (Wirksworth) combined with the DVO event at Lindop (TBC). It may work to have a night stay in a local hall, inviting West Midlands and Yorkshire and Humberside squads to join us.

Final note - more junior athletes required...

Are there any ideas or plans to link up with other (running) clubs (cross country, athletics, team sports) that have a junior section and offer them an alternative activity experience? The region does need more juniors to encouraged through the Orange level on to Green.

A Big Mistake on the Big Stage - Rachel Duckworth

This summer I raced at my second Junior World Championships (JWOC) in Baia Mare, Romania. This was my final season as a W2O, and I was one of the oldest members of the Great Britain team - I felt the pressure was on more than the previous year. I had great selection races in the spring and was excited to attack my world champs, focusing more on the forest disciplines. The Derbyshire hills were finally going to pay off on the steep, beech forested slopes in rural Romania.

A technical middle distance in beautiful forests has my name written all over it, I am much stronger in woodland and thrive off technical contour and rock features. The JWOC middle was just that. Personally, I had done a considerable amount of 'geeking' of the map and spent 2 weeks in the area getting familiar, so coming into the races I was excited to see how I could perform if it all came together successfully. Well, spoiler alert - it did not.

The start of an international race is quite high pressure and tense - no one talks, headphones on, in the zone. This doesn't help my own nerves, but I am starting to get used to these situations and I have found my own coping mechanisms. For example, I always make sure the GB staff member at the start is prepared to chat with me, usually about anything and everything and always complete nonsense. I find this calms me down and stops me from getting too worked up about the job at hand - at the end of the day, it is only orienteering and its just another

course. The JWOC middle was no exception to this usual environment but I think I coped with it well.

Out in the forest I was initially orienteering well, I was executing my strategy and plans for each control. Until number 3. I have no recollection of the reason I came offline, usually I can pinpoint a moment where it started to go wrong. But as you can see from the image attached below with my trace - I went very offline. Coming away from your plan is common, it happens all the time, but it is how you react and start to relocate that is the important aspect. I have done countless relocation exercises with EMJOS and on my own but trying to relocate is slightly different when you have a GPS tracker on your back which you know the arena and everyone at home is watching. You know they have all just watched you make a mistake - screaming at the laptop screen "don't go down the hill!" and "turn left, turn left!". This ramps up the pressure to relocate properly and fast. I relocated fast - but parallel to where I thought I was. An Australian friend even ran past me and tried to describe where I was, which solidified my incorrect judgement further.

I eventually worked out where I was and carried on the course with my ego and pride a little damaged. This mistake cost me 20 minutes on a course with a winning time of 25 minutes, one of



the worst mistakes I have made in years - let alone in an international competition. Let's hope this isn't a repeating occurrence!

One bad control didn't shape my whole JWOC 2023 experience

and I went on to have some great runs later in the week. I got a top 50 place and best GB girl in the long-distance race and had a great first leg relay run. I think this is testament to my resilience after a bad race and I am proud of myself for how I bounced back and executed some super orienteering.

Looking to the future, I think it has taught me a lot about how I react when things go wrong and given me experience on the international stage regardless of the result. I am very grateful

for the support EMOA has given me so far in my elite career and going forwards as I transition to the senior competition.

Stockholm JROS

I was delighted to be selected to go on the Stockholm JROS tour this summer, and it was 100 times better than I expected. The tour itself lasted 12 days, with 8 days of training and 4 days where we went to races. For the first couple of days getting used to the terrain was hard, with it being incredibly different to anywhere in the UK, so it was not just physically demanding but also mentally challenging. I quickly learnt to love the areas, with the bear rock, marshes and overall, incredibly runnable woods.



The first weekend there we did two races, a long and a middle. Saturday was the middle, where I got to see how I coped within the terrain in a race environment on the D21 course. I'm just going to say that it did not go well, with me spending 31 minutes on control 5 where I went off the map. However, I enjoyed the area a lot and it gave me learning experiences and things to target through the rest of the camp. The

next day, Sunday, I was starting last out of every competitor on the long course, which was exciting because it meant it challenged my skills a lot more too. This event took place in the same area as the middle on the previous day, so I wanted to try and redeem myself from that performance. I set out on the D18 and was focused on my direction and compass skills which was what failed me the day before. As I had expected I ended up running the whole course with only seeing one other orienteer, this at times created some doubt in my mind but I ended the run with only two minor mistakes. This race was what I needed to show that I could do it in new terrain.

Going into the rest of the tour we trained every morning and then would train either in the afternoon or evening depending on the session. Most training we did was morning and afternoon, but on the OK Ravinen club training nights we joined them and did their sessions which was really fun. For club training we did terrain intervals on one of them and on another we did butterfly loops where I focused on compass bearings. The rest of the time we trained we were

in some beautiful areas with open rock mounds, intricate contour detail and plenty of bilberries.

The last weekend we were there, we took part in the Stockholm champs, where we did the long and middle distance again. Saturday we did the long in a very intricate and complicated area, the 1:15000 scale was a shock to the system when I hadn't seen one since the JK long day. Overall, I really enjoyed the area, and especially enjoyed seeing my personal improvements since the previous weekend's races. The day was warm, and the area/ finish area was full of mosquitoes which was sort of annoying, but the area was beautiful. I had a couple errors which took me a while to sort out but overall, it was a lot better than the last long. The middle distance the next day was the last day on the tour, so we were running our race and then going straight to the airport. The course was good, it took place in the same area as the long had the previous day but felt entirely different for me. The light green vegetation was like swimming through trees which was funny.

Being away training with friends was very fun, spending all day with each other. During the time we were at the OK Ravinen hut we played football, volleyball and sometimes went swimming in the lake. On one of the rest afternoons, we went to the Vasa Museum (a museum about a big boat) which was interesting, and we had fun playing the games as well. We also went to Grona Lund where we spent the evening on all the rides which was a



really good way to relax for a while. I fully appreciate the opportunity I have had to work with amazing coaches such as Toni O'Donovan, Nick B, Nick J, and some GB athletes Chloe Potter and Ralph Street. Overall, it was amazing to spend time with my friends for nearly two weeks and doing a sport I really enjoy. It was also an exhausting 12 days, with the intense training and the races, however if I had the chance to go back and do it all again I would.



Gary competed for NOC, and twisted his ankle, but finished second.


Mike competed for LEI, but his shoe fell apart, but still managed to finish first.
