Whilst we are always seeking new Mappers, Organisers, Planners, Controllers and members to support the various event teams (Start, Finish, Parking, etc), we also want to identify members who are prepared to help collect-in controls and control site tags at the end of each NOC hosted event.

You will be provided with a map to go and collect perhaps four or five control stakes/SI boxes/kites/tags and return them to the Download area once all runners have been accounted for. This typically takes about 20 minutes but can be a bit longer or shorter depending on the terrain involved.
