# Notes from EMOA Meetings - 22<sup>nd</sup> April / 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024

**Volunteer Required** - At the AGM we do need a new Vice-Chair (we believe we have volunteers for all the other major roles for the AGM, but obviously members can always put themselves forward at the AGM). The role is not too difficult and we do provide support for anyone involved. The committee meetings are only every couple of months and it would be good to get some new names on the EMOA committee. Please could you consider volunteering for this role (if interested, contact any of the officials listed on the Contents page).

**EMOA AGM** - Details of this year's AGM (along with the minutes of the last AGM) are provided below

Levy Payments for MapRun Events - A recent memo from BOF has provided an update on whether levies are paid on free MapRun events. This has been a major topic in recent times as many clubs put on free MapRun events and had assumed no levy was payable and then BOF have requested a levy. In summary, the new statement is that if the event is free <u>and</u> that the results of the event are only available in the App itself, then no BOF levy is due (obviously if the event has an entry fee, <u>or</u> the results are available elsewhere then the levy is due).

Financial Secretary Report - As come to year end (June 30<sup>th</sup>), in terms of income the funds from BOF membership have ended up being within £1 of original budget. Event levies are very slightly higher than last year. Interest has also been higher as have moved monies into Deposit Account from Current Account. In terms of expenditure trophies were slightly under budget, there had been no spend on external conferences, but senior and talent expenses were slightly higher. So, the accounts are not too far away from project budget. The annual accounts will be created in next few weeks and be available for the AGM.

- NOC/24/1 MapActive. Learn advanced map-reading skills applicable to a range of outdoor activities, and practice them at an orienteering event.
- LEI / LOG no information supplied

Coaching - Chris Millard (DVO) and Andy Simpson (LEI and EMJS Coach) both successfully completed the first 8 tasks for their Orienteering Qualification, the pilot course for the new qualification which replaces, and is on a par with, the former UKCC Level 2 Coach and BOF Club Coach qualification from pre-2008. They now have to complete by the end of January 2025 and they may need support for this, if they need to 'practise' with some club members. Please support them.

Safeguarding - The BOF Safeguarding eLearning course continues to be popular, and this year has seen a large uptake partly due to updating part of the coaching license requirement but also from lots of members supporting tours and training within clubs.

The eLearning course can be accessed here: https://www.britishorienteering.org.uk/elearning. Please note that there is a cost of £10 per registration for eLearning. Your club may be able to support you with this requirement.

Other providers courses will still be accepted on submission of attendance certificates. Scan and email to <a href="mailto:coachingadmin@britishorienteering.org.uk">coachingadmin@britishorienteering.org.uk</a> and ask that this is added to your qualifications on the database. If you do the BOF eLearning course your attendance is automatically updated.

# DRAFT MINUTES OF THE 59<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON MONDAY 11<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2023 IN THE PACE ROOM, CLIFTON VILLAGE AT 19:30

**Present:** Sal Chaffey (DVO), Trudy Crosby (LOG), Roger Edwards (LEI), Mike Godfree (DVO), John Hurley (DVO), Jane Kayley-Burgess (DVO), Hilary Palmer (NOC), Chris Phillips (LEI), Amanda Roberts (LOG), Anthony Squire (NOC), Ernie Williams (LEI), Ursula Williamson (LEI), Dorothy Woodall (NOC), John Woodall (NOC), and Paul Young (DVO).

The Annual General Meeting being held at the Pace Room, Clifton Village, was declared as 'Quorate' by the Chair as 15 members were in attendance.

#### 1. Apologies for absence:

Anne-Marie Duckworth (DVO), Mike Gardner (DVO), Liz Godfree (DVO), Ranald Macdonald (DVO), David Olivant (NOC), Pauline Olivant (NOC), and Iain Phillips (LEI) offered their apologies.

In the absence of Mike Gardner, due to serious and unforeseen circumstances, Ernie Williams volunteered to take the Minutes.

#### 2. Approval of the Minutes of the 58th EMOA AGM held on Monday 12th September 2022.

Proposed by: John Hurley (DVO) Seconded by: Ursula Williamson (LEI). "That the Minutes as circulated are a true and accurate record."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### 3. Report from the Chair for 2022-2023:

Chris Phillips as Chair presented his Report and went through the Association's Events and activities in 2022 to 2023 – these included the number and formats of Events including EMLE, EMUL, EM Championships, and Level B Events such as <u>British School Score Championships at Shipley</u> Park (DVO). East Midlands Championships at Clumber Park (NOC), and a 2023 Heat of the CSPC&T at Beacon Hill (LEI), together with Event Officials Qualification / Volunteer Development Sessions, planning for Regional Conferences, the regular activities and involvement of Junior members and Coaches in EMJOS, Ernie Williams being awarded the Federation's 'Continued Contribution to Orienteering Award' for over 40 years of active involvement in the sport, and finally Chris's very real thanks to the other Officers and Committee members for their support throughout the past year.

4. Financial Secretary's Report together with membership information, and presentation of Accounts: Paul Young circulated copies of the 2022/2023 Accounts before the meeting began, which included his Financial Secretary's Report, the Accounts, the EMJOS Memorandum, the 2022/2023 Income from Event Levies together with Levy Analysis information, and the officially signed-off Income & Expenditure East Midlands Orienteering Association 2022/2023 Statement sheet, together with a set of 'Budget Proposals' for consideration by the members present later as Item 9 on the Agenda.

Paul thanked Roger Edwards, the Association's 'Independent Financial Examiner', for his support and work in scrutinising the financial activities during the past year and for formally 'signing off' the Accounts.

Fortunately the past year had been more normal than in previous years due to Covid-19 and the aftermath of the Pandemic, and the overall loss of £1460 was less than the budget prediction of £2678.

There had been a little higher than predicted expenditure regarding EMJOS but this was offset by the continuing participation at various venues of sessions and competitions within the East Midlands and further afield including JIRCS, and at the South Central weekend and in the Lake District.

Other financial outlay had been on Trophies and Certificates, Volunteer and Coach Development, 'Senior' and 'Talent' support, web licences, Bank charges, meetings, these in particular being offset by the use of 'Zoom', and the annual payment re EOC membership – Paul concluded his presentation of the 2022-2023 Accounts, with further details given in

the tabled and distributed Annual Report, and he thanked his fellow Officers, Committee members, and the East Midlands Clubs and members for their support and assistance..

#### **2022/23 Accounts:**

The EMOA year end is 30th June 2023, and Roger Edwards, as the Independent Financial Examiner, has reviewed the accounts, and they were officially signed-off on 6<sup>th</sup> September 2023 with the following statement:

"I confirm that the accounts for the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023 are consistent with the underlying records of the Association."

Roger was thanked again by all present for being the Independent Financial Examiner of the Association's Accounts.

#### 5. Approval of the Balance Sheet and the Income and Expenditure Statement for 2022/23:

No further matters were raised about the Financial Secretary's formal Presentation of the Association's Accounts.

Proposed by: John Hurley (DVO)

Seconded by: Ernie Williams (LEI)

"That the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement be approved by those members present."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### **6.** Election of Principal Officers:

Chris Phillips stated that two of Officers - himself as Chair and Paul Young as Financial Secretary – were willing to continue in place for 2023-2024. Pre-meeting an agreement had been reached with Anne-Marie Duckworth who had indicated that she would be willing to take on the role of Vice Chair for 2023-2024 and then as Chair for 2024-2025 if he was prepared to continue as Chair for the year 2023-2024 and this he had agreed so to do. Following the retirement of Ranald Macdonald, the role of Development Officer was currently vacant. The Chair asked if there were any nominations for this key role but there here were no nominations forthcoming.

The Principal Officers for the year 2023-2024 listed below were unanimously elected by a show of hands of those present and thanked for their willingness to both stand and serve.

#### **8.** Appointment of Independent Financial Examiner:

Roger Edwards agreed to continue as Independent Financial Examiner for the next year. Roger was once again thanked by the meeting for willingly performing this role.

#### 9. Approval of the proposed Budget for the year 2023-2024:

#### **Budget Proposals:**

At this point in the meeting Paul Young went through each of his recommendations and Budget proposals for 2023-2024 (see below), some of which were directly linked to the 2023 British Orienteering Federation AGM Agenda Item 6 Proposals iii to vii of the Board that are to be put to the membership on Saturday, 16th September 2023 i.e.

iii. to create part-year membership fees for new members;

iv. to create a membership category for families;

v. to create a membership category for young adults between the ages of 21 and 25;

vi. to create a levy fee category for senior non-member participants;

vii. to approve the member, levy and club affiliation fees from 2024.

whilst others were about the Association's Reserves and East Midlands Event Levies etc.

Paul, as Financial Secretary, gave an 'Overview' of his Budget Proposals with regard to both 2023-2024 and to future years 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 as a 'Long-Term Forecast', with specific reference to EMOA and to EMJOS, and the intention of resulting in a 'break even' situation annually, and in reducing the Association's 'Reserves' to £5000 by the end of the 2025-2026 financial year.

#### (1) Membership:

The Financial Secretary's recommendation was that there should be no change to the existing membership fees for the calendar year 2024 i.e. £3 per Senior member and £1 per Junior member and, if the 'Young Adult' category is introduced following the 2023 BOF AGM, that the annual fee for the new category shall be £1.00. There was a discussion regarding whether or not the fee in question should be £2, and a majority show of hands supported the £1 'Young Adult' membership fee for the year 2024.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: Hilary Palmer (NOC)

"The meeting is asked to approve the EMOA membership rates for the calendar year 2024 as Senior £3.00, Junior £1.00, Family comprising two adults and one child £7.00 and, if brought in at the 2023 BOF AGM, a Young Adult rate of £1.00" The proposal was carried nem con.

#### (2) Event Levies:

The Financial Secretary's recommendation was that there should be no change to the existing Event Levies for Level C and above Events for the calendar year 2024 i.e. £0.50 per Senior member and £0.10 per Junior member and, if the 'Young Adult' category is introduced following the 2023 BOF AGM, that the Event Levy for the new category being 21 years of age and above shall be £0.50, and with no change to the provision for the first £25 to be retained by the Organising Club.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: Ernie Williams (LEI)

"The meeting is asked to approve the EMOA Event Levy rates for Level C and above as £0.50 for Seniors, £0.10 for Juniors and, if brought in at the 2023 BOF AGM, a Young Adult rate of £0.50, and with the first £25.00 to be retained by the Organising Club."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### (3) Expenses Policy:

After a brief discussion and to general agreement the following proposal was put to the meeting.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: John Woodall (NOC)

"That the rates of '£0.25 per mile with an additional £0.02 per mile for each relevant passenger up to a maximum of £0.29 per mile' be approved for the financial year 2023-2024 for mileage incurred by members in relation to both EMOA and EMJOS matters."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### (4) Target for the 'Reserves Balance':

This item was discussed at length with a variety of opinions expressed, together with 'target figures' and future dates being suggested, and it was also noted that there was no proposal to be put to the meeting in relation to the EMJOS Reserves.

At the end of the discussion, and with the initial proposal not being put to a vote, it was agreed, by a show of hands, that it would be the mandated responsibility of the Principal Officers and Committee members to further debate the urgent matter of the Association's 'Reserves Balance' and to make a Report, finally agreed upon, to the membership within six calendar months of the date of the 2023 AGM.

**ACTION:** The Officers and Committee members are tasked to report back on the finally agreed figure for an 'EMOA Reserves Balance', and the date for implementation, to the membership by Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at the latest.

#### (5) HSBC Banking Mandate:

Paul explained the necessity of his next two proposals regarding the HSBC Banking Mandate and the 'Authorised Signatories' together with the formally named user of HSBC Business Internet Banking. Questions raised included the possible extension beyond the accepted three year term of office within EMOA, and the increasing incidence of fraud and money laundering and the need for the prevention of same.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: John Woodall (NOC)

"That the meeting shall agree to the updating of the existing Bank Mandate and any associated documentation such that the Principal Officers of the Association who are appointed from the date of the 2023 AGM have the ability to replace any existing authorised signatories."

The proposal was carried nem con.

Paul also put forward a proposal relating to the Financial Secretary being the approved 'Primary User' for HSBC Business Internet Banking. After a brief discussion this was agreed.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: Ernie Williams (LEI)

"That the members of the Association are agreed that the Financial Secretary of the Association is to be the 'Primary User' of the HSBC Business Banking facility."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### (6) Deposit Account:

Paul explained to the meeting that there were opportunities for the Officers of the Association, with the prospect of better and more favourable rates of Interest becoming available, to agree that part of the 'Reserves Balance' can to be moved to a fixed rate of interest limited term saver or deposit or bond account.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: Ursula Williamson (LEI)

"That the Principal Officers of the Association be granted the authority on behalf of the membership to open a new fixed term Saver/Deposit/Bond account into which, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, a reasonable part of the Association's 'Reserves Balance' can be deposited to accrue a better rate of interest than heretofore."

The proposal was carried nem con.

#### (7) Budget 2023 -2024:

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: John Woodall (NOC)

"That those present approve the Budget headed 'East Midlands Orienteering Association FY 2023/24 Budget v0.1' as set out on Page 4 Appendix 1 of the tabled 'Financial Secretary's Budget Proposal 2023/24' document". The proposal was carried nem con.

Paul Young was thanked by all present for his presentation and work on the financial affairs of the Association undertaken on behalf of all of the membership.

#### 10. Fixing the rate of Membership Fee for Associates and Clubs:

Following discussions about both the BOF Board's 2023 AGM and the Financial Secretary's Proposals, other than the Individual and Family Membership Fees agreed earlier in Agenda Item 9 (1), it was agreed that there should be no change in two other membership fees.

Proposed by: Paul Young (DVO) Seconded by: Ernie Williams (LEI)

"That for the calendar year 2024 the fee for Associate membership to remain at £10.00 and the fee for Club membership to remain at £15.00."

Proposal carried nem con.

#### 11. Changes to the Constitution and to Standing Orders.

Chris Phillips as the Chair indicated that there were a significant number of changes to the Constitution and Standing Order requiring approval by the meeting. These had been made available pre-meeting for download but, due to a technical hitch, the document would not open for either reading or printing. In these circumstances Chris Phillips made an executive decision to verbally go through the changes section by section, giving detail as and when required, prior to acceptance by a show of hands.

- (i) Of the thirty-nine separate amendments, twenty one of them required a change whereby 'Ltd' is to be put after 'British Orienteering Federation';
- (ii) The section referring to 'Open Clubs' and 'Closed Clubs' has been rewritten to make the distinction between the two clearer:
- (iii) With regard to mentions of 'BOF policies' reference is now made as to "where available on the BOF website";
- (iv) The section referring to the 'Re-election of Officers' has been re-worded to make it much clearer than before;
- (v) With regard to 'Signatories' on behalf of the Association the reference to 'cheques' has been removed.

In conclusion, following discussion on certain aspects of the proposals, it was unanimously agreed by those present to accept, by a show of hands, all of the proposed changes as listed in the document, except for any text that may be related to the Association's Reserves, following previous discussion on the same subject.

**ACTION:** A request was made that Mike Gardner be enabled to update the Constitution and Standing Orders, and ensure that the updated Constitution and Standing Orders be made available on the EMOA website.

#### 12. Plans for Coming Year: 2023/24:

The Chair gave details of plans, Events, and activities within the Association for the forthcoming year 2023-2024, including the hosting of JK 2024 World Ranking Event and Sprints Day 1 at the University of Loughborough and JK 2024 Day 4 at Stanton Moor. The Major Event Officials are in place and already working as Day Organisers, Day Planners, and Safety Officer etc, together with the externally appointed IOF WRE Adviser and BOF Grade A Controllers. JK 2024 Days 2 and 3 are being hosted by WMOA and taking place at Beaudesert in Cannock Chase. Members of the four East Midlands Clubs are already being approached to play as active a part as possible at JK 2024, both as helpers and competitors, particularly on Days 1 and 4, but also Days 2 and 3, especially as much higher numbers of competitors are expected than the average daily entry because of the accessible and central location of the East and West Midlands.

Mention was also made of LEI hosting the 2023 British Schools Score Championship and NOC hosting the 2024 East Midlands Championships. Club Fixtures Officers were asked to ensure that advance information on 2024 East Midlands League and East Midlands Urban Events was given to Regional Fixtures Secretary Ursula Williamson and EMEWS Editor Mike Gardner as soon as is possible, and that an EMOA Training Day is being planned for 2024. The members of EMJOS continue to be encouraged to take an active part in Events within the Region and further afield to gain experience of different types of terrain and to develop their talents in O-Sport. Finally, the Chair stressed the need for a Vice Chair to

be elected at the 2024 AGM, and indicated that the next meeting of the Committee is provisionally scheduled for Monday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

#### 13. Any Other Business:

There was no 'Any Other Business' raised apart from the Chair inviting all present to the 'Open Discussion' to be held following a tea, coffee, and biscuits break.

Those present were thanked for their attendance and contribution to the discussion on the Agenda items, and the Chair formally closed the 59<sup>th</sup> EMOA AGM at 20:45.



# A quick weekend on the continent - Interland 2024

Interland is the annual 6-sided match between England, 2 Belgian teams, France, Netherlands, and Luxembourg. This year it was hosted by Belgium in Habay, close to the French/Luxembourg borders.

After assembling on Friday night and catching the ferry across to Dunkirk, we had our warmup event on Saturday afternoon around a bordering forest to our race area. I had previously raced in these forests during the Junior European Cup in August of 2023 so was quite familiar with the terrain and my strategy going into the race. I tackled the numerous bingo controls well and enjoyed the high-speed orienteering. I finished in 4<sup>th</sup> - only seconds off the podium!

I've always loved the Interland competition and the format of the weekend with a high quality multi-generational team all socialising and racing well. The England team came away with the win overall, returning the trophy to home soil.

Joining forces with the Adult club member group allowed both to use the same area access and training exercises, so reducing the effort to hold the training day.

Looking forward to the <u>JROS Summer camp and tours</u> we have 3 juniors wishing to go: Eoin Simpson (M14) will be nominated for Lagganlia (Championship times already achieved); Ellie Simpson has put her name forward to the selectors of Czechia tour (early setbacks for the selection races with asthma breathing problems, has meant emails have been sent from myself and parents explaining the situation); and finally Hannah Mather has emailed Mark Saunders regarding her interest in going on the Gothenburg tour.

## Future training and events

Sprint training at Nottingham University 9<sup>th</sup> June (preparation for Sprint Champs at end of month) has been advertised to our squad, the neighbours as well as the Talent North and top tier 4/5 international athletes. Online entry to this event via NOC website. East Midlands will have a mixed ability group again, so some might migrate to the YHJS/WMJS groups. 
