The Club Secretary role focuses on facilitating bi-monthly committee meetings (capturing input, preparing the agenda, writing-up the meeting minutes and posting them on the NOC website). It also requires that any queries and requests made by British Orienteering or other stakeholders are forwarded to an appropriate member of the committee in a timely manner.

The role is not onerous. Amy will provide a full handover and the rest of the Committee will provide full support throughout. This role does not involve any direct engagement with the NOC membership (which is dealt with by the Membership Secretary).

Recent Results:

Eyam Moor (DVO):

This was a national event which offered both physical and technical challenges to participants, as well as the imminent arrival for storm Isha! Well done to all the 16 NOC members who took part. Richard Robinson was 2nd on the Black course, and Mike O'Neil was 2nd on the Short Blue. There were also top ten finishes for Kevin Lomas (Blue), John Woodall (Very Short Green), Lily Robinson (Yellow) and Grace Robinson (Orange).

Robin Hood Trophy - Sherwood Forest (NOC):

This too was a national event, our biggest event of the year. Almost 450 people from across the country took part on the day. There was NOC success for Hilary Palmer on the Very Short Green and 2nd place for Richard Robinson on the Black course. There were top ten finishes for Rose Schorah (Short Blue), Tim Booker (Short Green), John Palmer (Very Short Green), Lucy Sherratt and Victoria Hanman (Orange), Evan Llewellyn (Yellow) and Elodie Booker (White). The overall Robin Hood Trophy was won by SYO.

Events of this scale require significant volunteer commitment, so we should highlight the contributions from Anthony Squire who planned the excellent courses as well as putting-out and collecting-in the controls over that weekend. John Hurley (DVO) and Hilary Palmer acted as Controller and event Organiser respectively in what were long days.

A big thanks also to Dave Cooke (Permissions), David Olivant (map update), Andrew Ridgway (The Start Kite) and all the very many members who turned-up on the day to oversee Parking, Enquiries and Download, route marking, Start & Finish, control collection and Results. Sherwood Forest was a large area to cater for logistically on the day, but feedback from participants suggests that all our volunteer efforts were well received. Thanks to everyone involved.

Beacon Hill (LEI):

Twenty five NOC members took part in the EM regional event at Beacon Hill hosted by LEI. Those starting early had to contend with some cold and foggy conditions to find the first control, but the sun made an appearance for the later entries.

Tim Booker came first on the Short Green course and Kevin Lomas was third on the Blue. There were top ten finishes for Richard Willis, Paul Morris, David Booker, as well as Isaac and Emma Rosewell.
