#### **Recent Results:**

#### Strawberry Hill (NOC):

The final event of 2023 was held at Strawberry Hill and Ransom Woods near Mansfield in mid December where 249 participants took part in colour coded courses and returned to Download to enjoy a festive treat or two.

Richard Robinson came first on the Brown course with Ant Squire 3rd. Top ten finishes also for Paul Morris and Andrew Ridgway on Blue, plus Hilary Palmer, Jane and David Booker on Short Green.

This was also the concluding event for the recent MapActive participants who put in good performances on the Orange course. Many have subsequently signed-up as NOC members!

Thanks to Dave Cooke for obtaining permissions, Keith Streb and David Olivant for mapping input, Kevin Lomas for Planning, Ray Barnes for Controlling and Helen & Robert Parkinson for organising the event and all the catering.

Thanks also to all the helpers on the day - they play an essential role to ensure the event is successfully delivered. This is an event which attracts many from across the Midlands, and also plays host to the annual LOG Championships, so it was good for NOC to be able to continue its tradition.



#### **Recent Results:**

#### Ashbourne Urban (DVO):

Close on twenty NOC members started the first day of 2024 navigating the streets of Ashbourne. Helen Parkinson was first woman home in the WSV category and 6th overall on that course. There were also top ten finishes for Neil Rosewell, Andrew Ridgway, Paul Morris, Isaac Rosewell and Elodie Booker.

#### Bagworth (LEI):

The first EMOA forest event of 2024 saw some good performances from NOC Members. Richard Robinson came first on the Brown course. Hilary Palmer was the fastest woman on the Short Green coming third overall, closely followed by Richard Llewellyn. There were top ten finishes for Paul Morris and Kevin Lomas on the Blue course. Emma Rosewell was 2nd on Orange whilst Grace Robinson was first on the Yellow course, closely followed by Lily Robinson and Evan Llewellyn.

#### Robin Hood Trophy - 28 Jan:

This year's event will be held in Sherwood Forest on some of NOC's best terrain. It's always well attended and Ant Squire has no doubt planned some excellent courses. Be sure to book your place by midnight 21st January to guarantee your map.

#### Compass Sport Trophy - 18th February 2024:

The qualifying heat will be held at Cannock Chase where NOC will compete against seven other clubs for a chance of qualifying in the Final, later in the year. All members can play a role in this team event. ### The Start Kite – Entry Fee Payments:

The beginning of a new year often sees a review of costs. Thankfully, from an EMOA perspective, the fees for events in 2024 are not expected to change. Pressure on costs is increasing and card payment charges are an area of concern.

NOC members who use The Start Kite to enter NOC and LEI events can opt to pay by bank transfer rather than debit or credit card. This means that more of your entry fee can be passed to the club to help keep event fees low.



Simply set up The Start Kite as a payee in online banking and all future payments can be made securely and quickly. Your sort code and account name are passed to The Start Kite with the payment but your account number is not. All bank payments are acknowledged by email.

Approximately 40 percent of Start Kite payments were made by bank transfer in 2023. The extra income paid to the clubs was several hundred pounds.

The Start Kite bank details are displayed in your web browser when you opt to pay by bank transfer. If you need to access the details later there is also a link in the entry confirmation email.

## **New Year Member Opportunities:**

Every orienteering event requires a few volunteers to fulfill the roles of Organiser, Planner and Controller. And of course, every event needs an up-to-date map! So it's at this time of year that NOC asks for members to consider learning how to perform one or more of these roles.

Training typically consists of online and face-to-face courses, some background reading, plus time shadowing/working with a mentor on a 'live' event. Mapping and Planning also help to enhance individual map reading skills, so it's really useful for those looking to refine their orienteering performance too!

These are great opportunities to meet new people in the club, learn new skills and help NOC continue to put on regular events in the future.
