NOC's Urban Sprint Success Continues!



June has seen NOC's prowess in the Urban/Sprint discipline extended with wins at the British Sprint Championships as well as the delivery of a Sprint training day that attracted much praise from neighbouring orienteering clubs.

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British Sprint Championships - Warwick University, Coventry:

These were held on Sunday 23rd June with qualifying events in the morning and finals in the afternoon.

Richard Robinson won the M40A Final and Hilary Palmer came third in the W75A Final, just 13 seconds behind the winner! Ant Squire also secured a creditable 8th place finish in the M45A Final in a Championship/Gold level finishing time.

In the M65A Final, Mick Lucking and Paul Morris came home in Gold and Silver Championship times respectively.

There were also wins in the B Finals for Jane Booker (W70B), Pat Squire (M75B) and Richard Llewellyn (M70B).

Results and splits can be viewed on the <u>SI Results</u> pages. These were strong performances from a small club and bode well as the rest of the Urban/Sprint season unfolds.

Indeed, the next event is coming-up this Sunday, 30th June, at Nottingham Trent University in Clifton. This event is part of the East Midlands Urban League but includes courses for newcomers too. Hilary Palmer has planned some excellent courses around the university campus with some also venturing into nearby Clifton village. Be sure to enter via The Start Kite before the 26th to guarantee your map.

NOC's Urban Sprint Training Is A Hit:

NOC held a Sprint Training day on the campus of the University of Nottingham in June. It was effectively a local Level D event aimed at regional youth squads from East Midlands and neighbouring regions but was also offered to club members of any age too.

The format was the brainchild of Ant Squire who not only co-organised the event but also planned all the various courses (four individual sprint courses, each with short, medium and long course options as well as two Relay options).



Participants collected their maps at an initial briefing in the Assembly area (rather than at the Start), and each A4 sized map contained all the Individual or Relay courses on them which saved a lot of ink & paper.

Numbers were capped at 180 and all but a few of those turned-up on the day. Feedback was excellent with many highly positive remarks made at the venue and subsequently on our <u>Facebook page</u>. This was seen by many as an innovative way to expand the breadth of orienteering training opportunities and, anecdotally, a number of other clubs may adopt a similar format in the future.

Congratulations to Ant Squire and co-organiser Hilary Palmer for putting this event on. A big thanks also to all the helpers on the day, especially at Assembly & Download. This format did cause some extra work where <u>results</u> were concerned but the overall outcome was highly positive and has helped to keep NOC as a well respected club on the British Orienteering scene.
