Urban / Sprint Training at Nottingham University:

Ant Squire is busy planning an urban event on the campus grounds that will prove excellent training and preparation for a number of upcoming national and regional urban events.

For those relatively new to the sport, don't let the term "Sprint" put you off. The term is more a reflection of the type of course; short and therefore completed in less time than traditional courses. Often, at urban sprint events, participants undertake more than one course.

Ant's training session will take place on 9th June. He will be planning courses in various formats: individual, pairs and relays. This event will help to refine the core orienteering skills needed to succeed in tricky urban environments. Map scales are typically 1:4000 so are very detailed and features come at you surprisingly quickly! Assess how making a 'plan' compares in an urban versus forest surrounding. You'll also appreciate the importance of keeping your thumb on where you are whilst running on the campus amidst all the buildings. It's great fun and doesn't involve getting tripped up by brambles or having to go up/down steep and slippery slopes like we've had to recently!!

The timing of this activity couldn't be better. There are the British Sprint Relays on 22 June (see below), the British Sprint Championships (at Warwick University on 23rd June; two races each - entries close 9th June), and the regional East Midlands Urban League event at Nottingham Trent University at Clifton on 30th June.

Further EMUL events are scheduled for August (Coalville & Lincoln) and NOC is also hosting a national UKUL event on 6th October. You can use the <u>British Orienteering event finder</u> to discover other urban sprint events in nearby regional areas too.

Final details of Ant's session are being confirmed and will be available in the <u>Fixtures area of the NOC</u> <u>website</u>. So keep a look-out and book your place via The Start Kite when details are finally published.


British Sprint Relay Championships - Birmingham - 22 June:

Team Captain Mick Lucking has confirmed that the <u>British Sprint Relay Championships</u> will be taking place at Birmingham University on the evening of Saturday 22nd June. The first race will start at 5.00pm.

Apart from the elite class, teams of three across many age bands may participate. The only stipulation is that each team must include at least one woman. There are classes where all team members have to be over 40, over 55 and over 65.

Birmingham University is a good venue for sprint orienteering and it is one of the few opportunities to run in a NOC team. The club will pay the entry fees.

Those new to urban orienteering may find a <u>video of last year's</u> <u>competition</u> useful to watch.

New MapActive Programme - June & July 2024:

NOC is staging another iteration of the successful MapActive programme. Dates and venues will be::

The June dates will cover Stage 1 of the programme and introduce core skills. Stage 2 will cover more advanced skills including visualisation, contours, pacing and fine-compass work.

Recent Results:

Boundary & Tippings Woods (NOC):

The April NOC event was part of the EM League and attracted 178 participants on the rather windy Sunday (Storm Kathleen this time).

There were wins for Hilary Palmer (Very Short Green), Grace Robinson (Yellow) and Elodie Booker (White). There were a number of other podium places too including Richard Robinson (Brown), Isaac Rosewell (Light Green) and Tina Brindley (Orange).

British Orienteering Long Distance Championships: Report from Team Captain, Mick Lucking:

Thirteen NOC members travelled to Mulgrave Woods near Whitby on 13 th April for the 2024 British Orienteering Championships. Three runners secured podium finishes and received prizes from Steve Cram. Ben Squire came second on the M20 Elite course, Richard Robinson came second on the M40 Long class and Hilary Palmer came second in the W75 Long class.

On the shorter courses Grace Robinson won the W12B class, Evan Llewellyn came second on the M12B course and John Palmer came third on the M75 Short course. As usual the courses were long and hard, which were exacerbated by the inevitable muddy conditions.

British Middle Distance Championships:

Hilary Palmer successfully defended her W75 title at this year's championships which were held at Danefield, near Otley in West Yorkshire. The map on RouteGadget suggests this was another hilly affair and that Hilary's race was a tight one. Richard Robinson came second on the M40 course, and there were top ten finishes for Ben and Ant Squire. On the Yellow course, Grace Robinson came 3rd and sister Lily finished 5th.
