NOC hosting national CSC Competition:

The annual CompassSport Cup & Trophy competition is one of the most prestigious events in the UK orienteering calendar. NOC is hosting one of the qualifying heats at Clumber Park on 23rd February.

Jane Booker is busy organising the various aspects of the event whilst Ant Squire is putting the finishing touches to what will no doubt be another set of excellent courses.

Entry is open to all NOC members who have paid their 2025 membership fees.

Mick Lucking, the NOC Team Manager, is about to send an email with details about how to enter this competition as well as some of the other prestigious events coming in the next few months. Please keep a check on your Inbox (and an eye on your Spam folder just in case!).

Members have to run courses according to age, and the fastest two from each club will score points. However, even those who finish behind the scoring two can have a significant impact on the overall team score. Wherever they finish, they effectively reduce the score value of those who finish after them and that may be a 'scorer' from another club. Just a few points can make all the difference in deciding which clubs qualify for the Finals. So please consider entering this competition.

Apart from the fun of competing, the club will pay your entry fee if you volunteer to help-out on the day. We will need a large number of helpers for this event to allow for the fact that members will be starting their courses at different times.

The event has courses for all ages and levels of experience. If you do not want to run in the CSC category for your age group, you can still take part in the Light Green course, but this of course will not qualify for the CSC competition. Even if you do not plan to run on the day, your help volunteering would be greatly appreciated if you are free to help out on the 23rd February.

How you can help on the day:

Each area (Enquiries/Download, Parking, Start, Finish, Control Collection) will require lots of people on hand to cover on the day. Please put your name forward to help by contacting your Team Leader or Jane Booker (email: org20250223@noc-uk.org). In return, the club has agreed to pay the entry fee of those competing for what is a premium national event.

Hilary will also be hosting a map geeking Zoom call before the event to help participants prepare for their courses. Details for the geeking session will be sent by email beforehand with a prompt on the club website and on our social channels too.

The CSC will be a brilliant, if busy, day for all and will be a great shared experience for all club members. Start preparing now and contact your Team Leader or Jane Booker.
