Clean Sweep for Richard Robinson at the JK

Following on from his success at the British Night Championships, Richard Robinson won all the M40 individual classes at this year's JK Festival; the Friday Sprint, the Middle Distance on Saturday and the Long on the Sunday. Read the report below.

The 2025 Jan Kjellstrom International Festival:

This year's JK saw some strong performances from NOC members. Here's a quick summary (with special thanks to Team Captain Mick Lucking for providing input so promptly!).

The JK took place over Easter in areas near Sheffield and Leeds. Good Friday saw sprint races in the middle of Sheffield where Richard Robinson won the M40 age class and other top ten finishes included; Dave Schorah (M35) 4th; Jane Booker (W70) 5th; Anthony Squire (M45) 8th; Rose Schorah (W35) 9th, and Hilary Hodkinson (W70) 9th. Some of our newer members travelled up to Sheffield to see the impressive spectacle of the sprint race and provide support at the finish, which was just outside the Town Hall in the middle of the city.

Saturday was a Middle Distance race in Tankersley Woods just north of the city which was very tricky with a complex mixture of paths, spurs, re-entrants, pits and depressions. Richard Robinson won the M40 age class again and other top 10 finishes on long courses were: Dave Schorah (M35) 2nd; Anthony Squire (M45) 3rd; Hilary Palmer (W75) 6th; Jane Booker (W70) 8th, and Rose Schorah (W35) 9th.

In the Sunday events, Richard Robinson won the Long M40 class more than 2 minutes faster than his nearest M40 rival. Other top ten finishers were: Ant Squire (M45L) 4th; Monica Henderson (W35L) 9th; Helen O'Neil (W70S) 4th; Grace Robinson (W12A) 10th and sister Lily Robinson (Yellow) 8th.

Monday saw the Relay events and here too NOC put in an outstanding performance in the Senior Men competition to finish second out of 26 teams. The NOC team, Robin Hood, consisted of Dave Schorah, Ant Squire and Richard Robinson.

Grace Robinson also put in a strong performance at the JK. Grace teamed-up with friends from DVO and LEI to enter the Junior Relay event on Monday. This proved to be a good way for orienteers to experience the fun of the relay format and is likely to be explored again in the future. Grace's two individual forest performances on Saturday and Sunday culminated in her finishing 9th overall in the W12A class at the JK. A great result.

Congratulations to all the NOC participants for putting in such strong performances, and especially to Richard Robinson for being awarded the male performance of the weekend for his clean sweep. You can view all the results and study the courses on RouteGadget.

After a discussion at the recent EMOA Committee meeting about the allocation of age classes to courses at the East Midlands Championships, it was agreed that a survey should be carried out to determine the views of EMOA participants. NOC Member gets a taste of Spunch:

NOC member Jan Golan took part in the first Spunch event of 2025 held near Leek in Staffordshire and finished 6th out of 57 participants in the 120 minute Score event - a great achievement.

Spunch (satellite punching) is a form of orienteering that uses MapRun, the smartphone app, to "punch" virtual checkpoints in a rural setting, in this case, the Peak District. Participants use a paper map and compass to navigate to designated locations, with their phones indicating when they have successfully "punched" a checkpoint. It's a fun, accessible way to explore the countryside, suitable for a wide range of ages and fitness levels, and has been promoted by Andy Thornton (a member of MDOC).

Jan found the event really enjoyable and is a keen advocate of the Score format. This is also a format that many newcomers to the sport find useful as it allows the participant to decide which controls to aim for and get back in time to avoid penalties for being late.
